Measuring wind speed



The speed of the wind is that moment in time when YOU measure it with a reasonably accurate anemometer and record it. Further, that speed is only relevant for the location and that moment in time where YOU measure it.

As a pesticide applicator you want to know what the wind speed is when and where YOU are making the application. Without that data, complying with the pesticide label is problematic. Further, it does not matter what the speed is in New York City, New Orleans, or even Fargo.

Cleaning application equipment

To prevent corrosion to application equipment, crop injury, or cross-contamination of pesticides, it is important to decontaminate application equipment. Mixing, loading, and application equipment should be cleaned and rinsed as soon as you finish a pesticide application. Anyone cleaning pesticide-contaminated equipment must have instruction on proper safety procedures.
