Personal Protection while using Pesticides

Sometimes the use of pesticides may be necessary in controlling certain pests. Although they can be useful, pesticides can also be dangerous if used carelessly.

Here are some tips for protecting yourself when using pesticides:



- ALWAYS read the label first and follow the directions including all precautions and restrictions;
- Do <u>not</u> use more pesticide than directed by the label- twice the amount will <u>not</u> do twice the work;
- As directed by the label, wear the required protective clothing when handling pesticides;
- If the pesticide label does not state what protective clothing to wear, at a minimum wear water or chemical resistant gloves, long pants, a long-sleeve shirt, and closed-toe shoes;
- Do <u>not</u> spray pesticides outdoors on windy or rainy days;
